














































































































ANNUAL DAY CELEBRATION 2019 (MIDDLE SECTION)



QUEST FOR PERFECTION

"Practice leads to perfection" – At Griffins, we try our level best to set the parameters to the best and bring out the Excellency from every individual. With the same motto, our Principal took the initiative to enlighten us with Bloom's Taxonomy.

Bloom's Taxonomy is one of the most recognized learning theories in the field of education. Bloom's Taxonomy comprises three learning domains: the cognitive, affective, and psychomotor, and assigns to each of these domains a hierarchy that corresponds to different levels of learning.



The workshop aimed to train the teachers to use Bloom's Taxonomy to create learning outcomes that target not only subject matter but also the depth of learning they want students to achieve, and to then create assessments that accurately report on students' progress towards these outcomes.

It is really necessary to understand how to put impact on student learning. We must define our student learning outcomes – these are the goals that describe how a student will be different because of a learning experience. Learning objectives can be identified as the goals that should be achieved by a student at the end of a lesson. The focus should be on what a student will be able to do with the information or experience. Also, we must measure if the program or service implemented to facilitate the learning was effective.



To provide a deeper look at how Bloom's Taxonomy works in practice, Every department was asked to create a lesson plan on a certain topic and a demo class was conducted by the HOD of every department, after close and detailed discussion with his/her team.

This three- day seminar was comprehensive and complete and was the need of the hour. We are thankful to our Principal for this initiative.


















QUEST FOR PERFECTION

A workshop was conducted by Macmillan Education India for ourTeachers. *Mr. Kaushik Acharyya* and *Mr. Raju Ganguly* were the resource person for the workshop. *Mrs. Durga Yadav, Ms. Anjali Sharma, Ms. K. Asha, Ms. Manali Maharana, Mrs. Basanti Rawlo, Ms. Azmat Koser, Ms. Nandita Thapa, Mrs. Evelyn Benjamin, Ms. Sonali Mahananda, Mrs, Payal Kaha Modak* and *Ms. Alka Devi* were a part of the training, along with some math teachers of Sacred Heart School, Kharagpur *Vision Academy and St. Anthony's Church School.*





The workshop concentrated of teaching mathematics through CPA (Concrete-Pictorial-Abstract) method, basically a Singapore approach. It explained a three step learning process to clarify the concept to the students through hands on representation (concrete), iconic representation/visualizing (pictorial) & symbolic representation (abstract)

The workshop focused on the factors that block the creativity of the students and how teachers can make their classes and more interesting innovative. Mr. Ganguly also discussed about the India's performance in PISA (Programme for International Student Assessment), which evaluates educational systems by measuring 15 years old school students' scholastic performance in mathematics, science & reading to provide comparable data with a view to enabling countries to improve their education policies and outcomes.



We look forward to use these techniques and tactics to make our subject easier and express learning as a joyful area for every kid. Because at Griffins, we believe that we should learn and grow while enjoying.
